LexLeads—Student Leadership Opportunities

RBES students develop leadership skills through a mentor program. Professionals help students learn how to be productive members of society. Students also learn the 7 Habits of Happy Kids through implementation of The Leaders in Me program.

The school provides numerous activities for students to demonstrate leadership skills including Garden Club, Global Cardboard Challenge, First® Lego® League, 4–H, Kool Kids radio show, News Team, Recycling Team, Safety Patrol, Special Education Unified Learning Team and Unified Cheerleaders.

LexLearns—Personalized Learning in a Proficiency-Based, Standards-Based Environment

Students are learning in an environment where they know what standards must be learned, and they are expected to show proficiency in learning those standards. Students learn at different rates and different ways. They have choices about how they practice and demonstrate their learning. Each student is challenged at his or her individual learning level.

LexLearns—Spanish Partial-Immersion Program

Two classes in each grade level are enrolled in the Spanish Partial-Immersion Program. Students learn mathematics and science in Spanish and English language arts and social studies in English. All spoken language and print text in mathematics and science are in Spanish, while all materials in ELA and social studies are in English.

LexLives—Healthy Habits

Through a Farm to School Grant, students maintain a garden and learn about the environment, food production and healthy foods. Crops are shared with a local children's shelter. The RBES cafeteria serves a variety of seasonal South Carolina produce so that students can learn about healthy eating.

LexLives—Promoting Physical Activity

RBES offers an afterschool program called Run Hard. Participants learn about good sportsmanship through competition and the importance of making healthy choices.
